This year, we, Boronia Park Uniting Church and its related communities will participate in the National Church Life Survey (NCLS). The NCLS Research is a world leader in research focused on connecting churches and their communities. The most well known five-yearly project is called the National Church Life Survey, which has had millions of participants. Cooperating denominations, including Uniting Church, are a network for sharing practical resources to help churches and communities. We did this survey 10 years ago and now it is time to examine the congregation's wellbeing, spirituality, and health. There are English, Korean and Chinese (Traditional) version of the survey. Three options for running the survey.

1. Do it together, in person if possible

We know from experience, the best results come from everyone doing the Survey together; using either a paper form or online on a phone or tablet. By results, we mean getting the most number of people participating in the survey. Traditionally it's been held during the Sunday church service but can be at any regular gathering of your congregation.

2. Do it together, at home

Unfortunately, we are not sure whether not or churches may still be meeting in person by the time the survey comes around in November. In this case, we recommend still aiming to do the Survey together, but in their own homes. Most can do it online but some will need to receive their paper copies in advance in order to participate.

3. Do it separately if necessary

If you are not able to do the Survey together, then it can be filled out by members when they are able. Nominate a week in November and ask the congregation to complete the Survey providing either the link to the online form or paper copies for those that need it. Use Connect/Home Groups, Bible Studies and any other groups to encourage members to find the time and space to participate.

The survey takes around 20 minutes to complete either online or in paper format on <u>Sunday 14 November</u>. See your elder or the Minister if you have further question.
